Student Learning





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Reading And Writing

The School Year 2021 to 2022 brought about a year of firsts and some new developments to our curriculum. Phonics is the cornerstone for reading and writing as it teaches children the letter and sound relationship. Children learn how to decipher words by sounding them out; a technique that can be used at any age. We are continuing to embed phonics principles from SK to Grade 2 through a new, more intense phonics program from Columbia University's Teachers College Reading Writing Project (TCRWP). With our concentrated efforts in phonics, we are proud to note that there has been a significant increase in academic progress across all learning groups. In particular, those who excelled in September 2021 (10.9%) tripled to 39% by June 2022. Well done, students and teachers!

Continuing our commitment to improving reading amongst our students, one hundred Grade 3-6 students came to school an hour early each day to participate in our Reading Club. Reading helps students become more proficient at reading and improves their writing skills; plus, there is the added bonus of learning to read just for pleasure. The commitment of our students and staff will indeed show dividends.

Annual Public Speaking Competition

To assist students in their public speaking skills and confidence, we hosted our first TIS public speaking competition for Grades 4-6. Twenty students stepped up to the plate and did their best to impress our esteemed judges, Dr. Barry Ip (Executive, L&A at Wynn Palace and Wynn Macau), Ms. Janet McNab (Managing Director of St. Regis and The Sheraton) & Mr. Herbert Lee (Founding President of Macao Toastmasters). Not only did they have to prepare a speech ahead of time, but they also had to think on their feet and present a one-minute speech on a randomly chosen topic on the day! This would have sent any experienced speaker into a tail-spin, but not our students. They communicated effectively and with poise!

Math Competition

We also hosted our first ever TIS Math Competition with more than one hundred participants in Grades 2-6. This is an important event as it helps prepare students for external math competitions and tests their knowledge and problem-solving skills outside the classroom. In addition, this allows students to learn to think outside of the box so that in the future, they can apply this type of thinking to all sorts of situations and eventually, careers.

Testing Our Skills

We also encourage students to participate in external competitions as it is great to test our skills opposite other schools. For example, one thousand poems were submitted from schools across Macao in the forest ever poetry competition hosted by the University of St. Joseph. Two of our Grade 6 students made it to the finals, with 2nd place awarded to one of these students. That's an incredible effort. TIS students also entered international competitions such as the 'Design for Change,' which empowers students to take action towards a sustainable future. Our students created unique ways to solve some problems around the School and one of them placed 7th. We also had High School students win 1st & 2nd place in the inaugural Macau-wide English Essay Competition in which 1600 students participated. All exciting examples of how well our students perform while they are at school and on a world stage.



Common Sense School

To ensure our students are using technology responsibly, TIS became a Common Sense School. The Common Sense organization provides schools with tools that assist students in using technology for learning and life. It also teaches students how to make smart and ethical decisions when using technology, an essential aspect of our lives going forward in a digital world. This led to our first ever Digital Citizenship Week. It was brilliant to see the children participating and reflecting on how their actions impact social and emotional wellbeing. Also, all our new families and Grade 1 families attended our mandatory "Keeping Children Safe On-line" presentation. This is designed to help families navigate the digital world and give them strategies to assist their children.

Our Commitment of Excellence to our Students

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International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme

From academic rigour to making a difference in today's world, the IB Diploma is internationally recognized as one of the most prestigious qualifications a high school student can attain.

As part of our commitment to excellence, TIS offers the IB Diploma Programme (IBDP) to our Grade 11 and Grade 12 students to help better prepare them for the rigours of University.

This intensive two-year programme was offered concurrently with the Alberta High School Diploma programme during the 2021-22 School Year. Students were given the option to pursue a full IB Diploma or a partial IB Diploma in specific subject areas. Those students who choose a full IB graduated with two official diplomas, Alberta and IB. One student graduated with a prestigious Bilingual IB Diploma.

Moving forward into the School Year 2022-23, those students in good academic standing will be given the option to pursue either the Alberta Diploma or the IBDP, thus eliminating the need to complete two sets of exams. All Grade 11 students pursuing only the Alberta High School Diploma must take at least one IB Diploma course.

IB Primary Years Programme

TIS will also apply for authorization to offer the IB Primary Years Programme (PYP). This ensures that our entire student body will access an international education method, further showing TIS's commitment to excellence for our students.





Changes to IB Program at TIS

Students may take one or more IB Diploma courses without fulfilling all the requirements of a full IB Diploma. These courses are graded on a 1-7 scale, with 7 being the maximum grade. All IB Diploma courses have a set of externally graded assessments ranging from 60-80% of the final grade. In addition, internally assessed coursework undergoes external moderation by the IB before the release of the final marks.

Commencing the School Year 2022-23, all Grade 11 students must take the IB Global Politics course. In addition to the mandatory Global Politics course in Grade 11, only IB courses will be available for students in Art, Business, Economics and Mandarin. We will expand this approach in the 2023-24 academic year to include all Science, Mathematics, English and Language courses. As a result, our Grade 11 students will primarily study IB courses in their classes in that academic year. The Alberta course content is covered concurrently, and Alberta transcript credits are granted via the IB course delivery, incorporating Alberta outcomes.

We believe this shift in curricular focus will provide all our students with the benefits of taking IB courses and better prepare them for future studies.



Student Learning

IB Diploma Programme at TIS

Students pursuing an IB Diploma are required to take six IB Diploma Courses. As part of the IB Core, these students take a Theory of Knowledge (TOK), write an Extended Essay (EE), and participate in Creativity, Activity and Service (CAS) project and experiences. The TOK and EE are graded on an A-E scale. The achievement results in six IB Diploma courses with 42 points available. Three points are available from the result of TOK and EE combined. The maximum total points attainable in an IB Diploma is 45.

Our International Curriculum and our unique Approaches to Teaching and Learning prioritizes developing learning skills such as research, evaluation, critical thinking, application & synthesis of concepts, and building positive character traits - qualities that international universities look for in applicants. The infusion of Experiences and Community programs provides a focus on educational experiences beyond the classroom. These programs enable students to connect their learning in the classroom to real-world events and issues, generating Authentic Learning experiences.

Therefore, TIS strives to provide opportunities for every student to grow and excel in whichever area of personal interest and natural aptitude they hold. Learning Outside the Classroom

Extracurricular Activities (ECA)

During the 2021-22 school year and incorporating local business providers, **74 ECAs** were offered **over three sessions**, with **780 student participants**. This has been the greatest breadth of activities that TIS has provided and we look to expand further this year. Students were able to choose from a variety of options including: physical activities, crafts, or more academic pursuits like learning a new language or honing their university writing skills. By participating in these activities, students are extended beyond their comfort zone and establish friendship groups to explore their creative or academic interests. These activities open up opportunities to make new friendships, collaborate with younger students or learn how to communicate effectively with the local community. The aim is not to divert students from academia but to help develop a more well-rounded student who engages in educational and recreational skills — character blueprints which universities and colleges admire.











Leadership & Performance Activities (LPA)

Leadership and Performance Activities are another essential part of student life at TIS. It is a way for students to develop their leadership skills, collaborative skills, and immerse themselves in an area of interest in addition to building perseverance by starting a long term project and completing it. More than 710 students took advantage of clubs such as Model United Nations, Duke of Edinburgh International Award, Volunteer Team, Music & Drama productions, and Student Leadership. Not only do groups like these help in building critical interpersonal skills, but they also provide a point of interest in University applications.

One of the highlights of our year in athletics is the DSEDJ competitions, where we have the opportunity to undertake athletic competition with other schools in Macao. Our athletes put their best effort forward and placed well in many competitions last year. In soccer, the U20 boys' team placed 4th. The result of the Soccer U12 boys' team Group C saw TIS share 1st place with Dom Bosco. One student in particular, Caia Reichard, dominated yet again in the tennis singles and placed 3rd place in cross country, which is no easy feat! In track & field, the girls came in 2nd place in both 100 metre and 200 metre categories. There were numerous first places in our swimming meets, such as the 50-metre backstroke and freestyle events and the 4 x 50-metre medley. Special mention goes to Sophia Wong, who set a new record for the 100-metre backstroke competition.

This solemn ceremony is a wonderful way to cultivate pride, students' patriotism and love of Macao. It also embodies best wishes to the students and the teachers for a successful school year. This helps bring the two schools together and forge stronger ties.



Exploring Our Local Culture

Learning about our local culture helps to enrich your child's educational experience and helps those from diverse backgrounds understand the culture in which they have found themselves. In addition, the understanding and appreciation of different cultures is an important part of an international school experience.

This year, from Kindergarten to Secondary school, your children had the opportunity to immerse themselves in Chinese culture. Our teachers created different avenues of study to enrich their understanding via study of poetry, the Chinese Zodiac, paper making, crafts, storytelling, and celebrating special events such as Chinese New Year and Mid-Autumn Festival, as well as learning to make traditional food!

Sharing these experiences with friends helps broaden their horizons and gives them a deep appreciation for heritage, a fundamental part of schooling at TIS! Here is a deeper look at what your children learnt about this year!

Immersing in Captivating Traditional Experiences

- First experience of landscape painting Inspired by "A Thousand Miles of Rivers and Mountains", the children also began to explore Chinese landscape paintings and felt the changes in the depth of ink on paper.
- By reading the story "The Origin of the Chinese Zodiac", the students learned about the twelve species of animals that represent the Chinese New Year, and knew that thisyear is the Year of the Tiger, and consolidated their understanding of "the five senses and colors.
- Experience different forms of artistic expression in Chinese culture through paper cutting.
- Middle school students were invited to the Kindergarten to perform Chinese painting, and kindergarten children observed and experienced Chinese painting.
- The Kindergarten Chinese New Year cultural experience classroom can be visited and experienced by parents and students, and has received high praise from both parents and students.
- Mid-Autumn storytelling and the making of mooncakes to share.
- Dragon Boat Festival: Dragon Boat Story, Making Zongzi, Making the Year of the Tiger Spring Festival Booklet
- Chinese New Year: Traditional Chinese Costumes, New Year Stories, New Year Customs and traditions











Fine Arts

Drama

Besides being an entertaining pursuit, acting helps build confidence, promotes teamwork, and teaches children how to adapt to changing situations. Learning these life skills are crucial for children as they grow. From the classic to the modern, our drama teams put on some fabulous events that showcased the wonderful talent we have at TIS.

'Caught Inside'. Written by children around the world, our cast of talented actors take on the roles of characters living life in lockdown, isolation, quarantine. Is this a case of life imitating art?



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'You Can't Take It With You,' reinforcing the idea that you can only live life to the fullest by doing what you love. It was a fun way to present an important concept and our cast and crew did not disappoint.



'Three Sisters', by Anton Chekhov is a drama that had our students portraying life in Russia at the turn of the last century and the difficulties it entailed.





Elementary School Musical

A little bit of fairy dust was sprinkled through the Black Box Theatre as seventy eight Elementary students brought to life the magical 'Into the Woods JR.' The performance entertained a sold-out crowd of appreciative students and families.







Multimedia

Creativity is expressed in many different ways and one of these ways is through the use of technology to express an innovative side. In Multimedia A, they started the year by learning the principles of design using different programs such as Adobe Photoshop and Illustrator. The class then moved into photography and also learnt how to print on different objects. Students were able to use their graphic design skills to print on a variety of materials including: T-shirts,pillowcases, totebags, canvas, ceramic, and wood. In Multimedia B the class commenced with learning how to create films, then advanced their photoshop skills by creating a five photo themed graphic design project. The students also learned about 2D animation as well. Multimedia C students used industry standard software to create the first Grade 12 magazine that was sold to students and families as a memento of their graduating year.















Arts Night

It is essential to showcase our students' work to the broader TIS community, and our annual Arts Night is designed to do just that. This night celebrates the joy that art brings to our students from Kindergarten right through to Grade 12 and commends the huge variety of creative talent of our students.









Our IB Art Students presented an original body of work that was the culmination of a demanding two year course of study. The work was based on their own personal experiences and was showcased under the theme, " 苦: It's Good For The Plot.". Blooming with creativity and innovation, the gallery was filled with their beautiful artwork, demonstrating the thought-provoking process and immense skills and abilities of our students in the IB Art programme while developing and perfecting their technical skills and growth as artists. As is our custom, the students put together a silent auction where, they donated part of their earnings to charity.





Community Service

Service to our Community

As an international school, it is crucial to instill in our students a sense of giving back to the community, which has been so welcoming and supportive of our School. Our mission statement encourages students "to problem solve, think critically, and make positive changes in our global community." Giving back is not just monetary; it also includes participating in events that raise awareness of global & local issues. By giving their time and effort, students learn to appreciate via community contribution.

TIS had planned to kick off this school year by participating in two community events that help raise money for charity - The Run of Hope and Swim for a Cause. However, these events were cancelled due to the unpredictability of COVID restrictions and inclement weather at that time of year. This just meant our students would have to look for other ways to contribute to the community.





Volunteer Team

Our volunteer team undertook opportunities to fully participate in our community through various activities. This included volunteering at the ANIMA Cat Paradise shelter, and representing TIS through charity flag sales for organizations such as World Vision, Macau Special Olympics, Bosco Youth Service Network. Our students also planted vegetables in our TIS garden and donated to the Oxfam Vegetable Recycling Initiative, which distributes food to needy families.

Student volunteers spent weekend time to support disabled children from Kai Chi School. They assist in various interest classes that educate and develop skill sets for their students through sensory classes such as dance and music. Our students also participate in performances to create positive and lasting impressions for the special needs children they serve.

As a recycling initiative, the team gathered and recycled CNY red packets supporting sustainability initiatives in Macau.

The Senior Smart City Experience Day benefited from our volunteer's knowledge of all things technology showing the senior citizens how to use their smart devices.

At the Oscar Farm Camp students got to experience guided nature walks, an introduction to basic agricultural knowledge, team-building activities, first-hand experiences with farming methods as well as experience a closeness to nature. What a great day for them all.

These acts of kindness and community immersion genuinely reflect the values that TIS helps to develop in our students.



School Benefit Concert

Our High School Student Council forged ahead with the annual Benefit Concert. This initiative started in 2009 to raise money for the Sichuan earthquake and has become one of the most significant events that the Student Council hosts. This event is exceptional because each student council committee members work together to produce the show. There were 15 student acts of diverse genres, ranging from jazz singing to classical music to Latin dancing to modern k-pop style dancing. The acts were met with booming applause and cheering from the audience. Every one of the performers was outstanding, but none of this could've been possible without the fantastic backstage crew and the superb tech booth (all composed by students), and the hard work and months of planning undertaken by the dedicated student council executives!

Over 16000 MOP was raised at this year's Benefit Concert and donated to the Macau Society of Registered Psychotherapists (MSRP).



Walk for Water

This year's Fun Run (a.k.a. Walkathon) took the name TIS Walk for Water in honour of the Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) #6 Clean Water and Sanitation. The Walkathon raises awareness about the distance people in developing countries, often women and children, need to walk daily for water, which is about 6km. That's the equivalent of 15 laps around the perimeter of the front field of our School!

Many students went beyond and immersed themselves in the experience by carrying huge water bottles and feeling how difficult a task that would be to transport water over such a long distance.



Tiger Traits in Action

As a way of practicing the Tiger Trait: Caring, our younger students from primary school leadership also contributed funds earned through bake sales and candy grams. During the lead-up to Christmas, the team donated some of the proceeds to the Boxes of Hope charity. In addition, our Grade 5 and 6 students helped decorate 40 shoe boxes in the IDEA Lab, which the student leadership then packed with supplies for disadvantaged children in Macau so that these children could feel special on Christmas Day. The ladies at the International Ladies Club of Macau made this fantastic initiative possible.

Another portion of these funds was donated to the local animal welfare association, Masdaw, which desperately needed a new space for their dog shelter.

By collaborating with our school community and local organizations and businesses, our students learn the actual value of what it means to "make positive changes in our global community."



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SDG Goals and Activist in Residence A Year for the Ocean- School Wide Program



Continuing to respond to the United Nations' 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) set up in 2015 by the United Nations General Assembly, TIS students embarked on a new journey to make a difference in our world. The 2021-22 academic year focused on SDG #14 - Life below water - naming this year's theme "A Year for the Ocean". With the help of this year's Activists in Residence, marine biologist Andrew Taylor and Dr Karen Tagulao, TIS students learned about the impact humans have on marine life and how we can take steps to rejuvenate fragile marine areas. Students aimed to raise 150,000 MOP to fund the TIS Coral Restoration Project to restore degraded coral reefs in Lembongan, Bali, Indonesia.











First Ocean Conference

It was also the first year that TIS hosted its very own Ocean Conference! Middle and high school students had the chance to participate in various activities ranging from the local mangrove junk boat tour to the prototyping of coral restoration structures over two days. In addition, students gained valuable knowledge related to marine conservation, ecotoxicology, microplastics and more.

There was also a Coral Restoration Design Challenge.The groups gathered in the school's Idea Lab where students were able to utilize the countless resources available, from 3D printers to wood working tools. The winning design would be recreated in Nusa Lembongan by the Blue Corner Dive team and planted on the seafloor of the degraded site. The award was given to the group of three (Jeya Verschuren, Clio Chan, and Matilda Griffiths) who constructed a cost-effective, modular coral restoration structure. This structure will be built and transferred to the ocean floor in Nusa Lembongan.

they involved themselves in a system of change, coral restoration We are proud to see TIS students becoming positive agents of change that will go on to make the world a better and safer place to live.

Through a series of initiatives, TIS students gathered creative ways to promote awareness and raise funds for the cause. Such initiatives included an exciting book launch by our Kindergarten students, bake sales from Elementary students and a Schoolwide art exhibition displaying beautiful pieces created by students of all grades throughout the year that were later auctioned.

Students had a chance to gain knowledge of ocean science and learn how they could make a difference in our underwater life. Through Q&A sessions with Andrew, Karen and other marinelife experts, STEAM challenges, the Junior Marine Biologist after-school program, field trips to Macao's wetlands, and a mangrove exhibition, students became part of the solution as they involved themselves in a system of change, coral restoration and addressed ocean pollution as well as climate change.
University and College Placements

The Class of 2022 is the first class to experience COVID during their entire high school journey. Despite the challenges, these 68 students persevered and earned offers from 111 international institutions and 8 million MOP worth of scholarships. Two of our students secured offers from Imperial College London, ranked #7 worldwide, two students were offered positions at UCL ranked #8 in the world. Overall our students secured offers from 29 of the top 100 universities in the world! Congratulations Graduates!

This is a huge achievement and testament to the dogged determination and hard work of our Students and their Academic Counsellors, Jody Hubert and Charles Wester. They encouraged students to stretch past what they regarded were their limits and consider more university options.

In this Academic Year, 68 students graduated with an Alberta High School Diploma, of which 3 students completed the full IB and 15 completed a partial IB concurrently. 44% of the class graduated with Honours (>80% average), 20% graduated with Distinction (>90% average) and 4% graduated with Scholars (>95% average). These are excellent achievements and we honour those students who have pursued academic excellence with vigour.

We are proud of the Class of 2022 and look forward to hearing of future successes.

The school is audited annually by DSEDJ and reports its financial status to Alberta Educaiton.



TIS Parent Association

The TISPA Executive Committee comprises parents who work together to strengthen the bond between home and school and believe that parent participation is at the core of building a solid school community. Parent involvement makes a significant statement about the importance of education, reinforces the values of TIS, and benefits all of the members of our community.

During the academic year of 2021/22, TISPA meetings were held on the second Wednesday of each month to discuss the numerous activities occurring at the school and how it affects the students. With the primary goal to ensure that parents are happy at TIS and to advocate to the school on their behalf, TISPA meetings are attended by parents and teachers in an open discussion about the topics on the meeting agendas. Meeting minutes are shared publicly by the TISPA team.

Proceeds from events organized through the school in the year 2021/22 accumulated at MOP 99,951.79 and mainly came from the following events:

Campus Development

The IDEA Lab is where students can be hands-on to design, experiment, code, craft, tinker, draw, 3-D print, or collaborate using hightech or low-tech equipment.

The space encourages creativity, and it's been the bounding box for many visionary projects that the students worked on this year. From 'Design for Change' idea inception and development to the Coral Restoration Design Challenge, the IDEA Lab has been the go-to space to nurture innovation through hands-on experimentation.

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
